- Canada is the second largest country in the world.
 - 2- What are the schools that teach students from grade 9 to 12 known in Canada?
 - High Schools or Secondary schools
 - 3- How can you study at a Canadian high school as an international student?
 - ❖ Apply for admission from a Canadian high school
 - * Receive a letter of acceptance (LOA) from a Canadian high school

- 4- Who needs a study permit to study in Canada?
 - ❖ Most foreign nationals need a study permit to study in Canada
- 5- What is a study permit?
 - A study permit is a document the Canadian government issues that allows foreign nationals to study at designated learning institutions (DLIs) in Canada.



- 6- What do you need to apply for a study permit?
 - ❖ To apply for a study permit, you need...
 - > a letter of acceptance (LOA) from a designated learning
 - > proof of identity
 - > proof of financial support

You may also need

- ➤ a letter of explanation
- ➤ a Québec Acceptance Certificate (CAQ)
- > a custodian declaration (minors only), or
- > other documents

 - **♦** Yes
- 8- What is a designated learning institution?
 - ❖ A designated learning institution is a school approved by a provincial or territorial government to host international students.
- 9- How long ahead of time do you need to apply for a study permit at a secondary school?
 - * At least 6 months in advance

- 10- What do you need to earn your Ontario Secondary School Diploma?
 - To earn a high school diploma in Ontario, students must:
 - > earn 18 compulsory credits
 - > earn 12 optional credits
 - > pass the literacy requirement
 - > earn at least two online learning credits
 - > complete a minimum of 40 hours of community involvement activities

 - **❖** Yes

The courses you took in your home country will be evaluated then transferred as a Canadian high school credit.

- 14- Is it cheaper to study undergraduate programs in Canada or the US?
 - Yes

It is cheaper to study in Canada than to study in the US.

For the undergraduate students, the tuition fees in Canada range from CAD 5,000 to CAD 20,000 per year. Whereas the tuition fees in the US for the undergraduate courses start from USD 23,000 per year.

 - Student Residence
 - ❖ Off-Campus Shared Apartment or Condominium
 - ❖ Host Family/Homestay
 - Furnished or Unfurnished Apartment Rentals
- **16-** How much does a homestay monthly fee cost?
 - ❖ It depends on different elements such as: location, house condition, private or shared bedroom, etc.

- 20- When does a regular Canadian school year start and finish?
 - ❖ A regular school year in Canada is typically from September 1 to June 30.



- 21- What are the school holidays in Ontario, Canada?
 - Labor Day
 - Thanksgiving Day
 - Christmas break

 - ❖ Mid-winter break
 - Good Friday
 - Easter Monday
 - Victoria Day

 - ❖ International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic
 - ❖ Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
 - ❖ Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic
- **26-** How many credits do I need to earn to achieve a high school diploma in Ontario?
 - ❖ 18 compulsory credits
 - ❖ 12 optional credits
 - Pass the literacy requirement
 - ❖ At least two online learning credits
 - Complete a minimum of 40 hours of community involvement activities
- 27- What are the compulsory credits?
 - ❖ The 18 credits that students must earn to get their Ontario School Diploma:
 - 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
 - 3 credits in mathematics (at least 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
 - 3 credits for group 1, 2 and 3 courses (1 credit in each group)
 - 2 credits in science
 - 1 credit in Canadian history (Grade 10)



1 credit in Canadian geography (Grade 9)

1 credit in the arts

1 credit in health and physical education

1 credit in French as a second language

0.5 credit in career studies

0.5 credit in civics and citizenship

28- How to choose courses in Canadian high school?

- ❖ At FH, Guidance Counselors support you to create a personal study plan, then choose the courses for you to study depending on your background and what you might want to pursue after high school.
- ❖ If you're not sure what your post-secondary future holds, keep the following tips in mind while choosing your courses:
 - a. Take courses that sound interesting to you.
 - b. Discuss with guidance counselors.
 - c. Try to keep your options for post-secondary open.
 - d. Learn a subject you have not spent much time in before. Who knows, you may love it!
 - e. Talk with others who have attended colleges or universities and decide which type of study would be of most interest to you.

- **30-** How is the weather like in Toronto?
 - ❖ Toronto has a semi-continental climate, with a warm comfortable summer and a cold winter.
- 31- What are the best ways to get around Toronto?
 - ❖ The Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) that runs three modes:
 - ➤ Subway
 - ➤ Bus
 - > Streetcar
- 32- When you arrive in Canada, what should you bring?

When you arrive in Canada, you'll meet a <u>border services officer</u> who will make sure you meet some basic requirements. To enter Canada, you must

- have a valid travel document, such as a passport
- have the port of entry <u>letter of introduction</u> the visa office sent you when they approved your study permit
 - This letter has your permit reference number, which we use to issue your study permit.
- have a copy of a valid letter of acceptance from your school
- have letters of reference or any other documents the visa office told you to bring



- have a valid <u>electronic travel authorization</u> (eTA), a valid visitor visa (temporary resident visa), a valid green card (or <u>equivalent official proof of U.S. status</u>) or another valid travel document
 - If you have a valid eTA, it'll be linked to the passport you used to apply for your study permit.
- have enough money for your stay (the amount you will need can vary—it depends on things such as how long you will stay, and whether you will stay in a hotel, or with friends or relatives)
- have valid immigration medical exam results (<u>if you needed one</u>)
